

Hapag-Lloyd extends its WWA shipping service to South Africa to cover the citrus season from May to July



The shipping company Hapag-Lloyd reorganizes its West-Europe-West-Africa (WWA) service: in addition to the West African ports, the rotation is extended to the ports of Durban and Coega from May to July.

Hapag-Lloyd offers a direct import service from South Africa to Northern Europe during the fruit harvesting season.

The Dachan Bay Express - first export vessel in the rotation - is due to arrive in Le Havre on April 26.

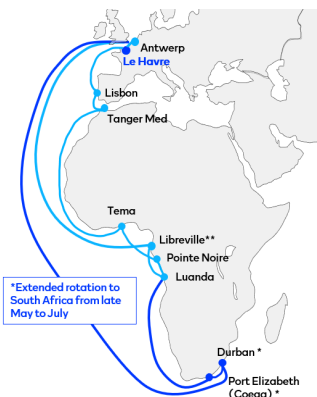
Details of the weekly West-Europe-West Africa service (WWA)

- Rotation from **August to April**: Antwerp - Le Havre - Lisbon - Tanger Med - Tema - Pointe Noire - Luanda - Libreville - Antwerp
- Rotation from **May to July**: Antwerp - Le Havre - Lisbon - Tanger Med - Tema - Pointe Noire - Luanda - Port Elizabeth (Coega)* - Durban* - Antwerp

- Competitive import transit times with South Africa:
