HAROPA PORT strengthens its weekly service offering to West Africa



Shipping lines Hapag-Lloyd and Arkas have now added Le Hayre to their regular service rotation directly linking Northern Europe to West Africa.

This service, which has a 35-day rotation, made its first call at Le Havre on 23 June last.

This regular maritime service – under the name "West Africa Express (WAX)" for Hapag-Lloyd and "Europe Africa Service (EAS)" for Arkas – links Northern Europe to West Africa under a Vessel Sharing Agreement (VSA) between the two lines.

It comes as reinforcement for the coverage of the West-Europe - West Africa Service (WWA) service provided by Hapag-Lloyd – and which also calls at Le Havre – and offers new, optimum and complete coverage of West Africa via Tangier, connecting with the same line's DEX and MWX services.

- ► Weekly call on Wednesdays at the <u>Atlantic Terminal</u> CNMP stevedoring
- ▶ 5 ships: 4 Hapag-Lloyd, averaging 4,500 TEUs and 1 Arkas, approximately 2,500 TEUs
